Subject: Less than a week to register for IPAFFS for High Risk Feed and Feed not of Animal Origin

With less than a week to go, we strongly encourage you to register for IPAFFS now!

Over the past couple of weeks, hopefully you will have seen the information including user guides and webinars set up to support you, with the transition to IPAFFS.

We successfully rolled out IPAFFS for Live Animal imports via a CHED-A on 23 November and yesterday we launched Product of Animal Origin via CHED-P. On Monday 14 December we are launching the third phase of the roll-out of IPAFFS, focusing on High Risk Feed and Feed not of Animal Origin.

This phasing in of IPAFFS will help prepare for the end of the EU Transition Period on the 31 December 2020.

This means all notifications to Great Britain (GB) from non-EU/third countries which are currently made in TRACES on a CHED-D must be made in IPAFFS for consignments arriving in GB on or after 14 December 2020.

Please note: The registration service has planned maintenance from 5pm, on Friday 11 December until midday on Sunday 13 December. If you haven't registered, we advise you to complete the registration process before this time.

Please see table below that sets out the phasing in of IPAFFS.

If you are an importer of Live Animals or Germinal Products from the EU, you must continue to use IPAFFS as you do now. Please ignore this email.

Please note: Imports into Northern Ireland must continue to be notified via TRACES.

What you need to do now

<u>Please note: You only need to register for IPAFFS if your current function is to create notifications on TRACES NT, acting as the person responsible for the load.</u>

 If you haven't already, <u>register for IPAFFS</u>. You will need a Government Gateway account to do this • If you are already registered for IPAFFS, please check that you have your Government Gateway ID and password. If you have forgotten these, or your memorable word, contact the APHA Service Desk on 03300 416 999 or email APHAServiceDesk@apha.gov.uk

What you need to do from 14 December 2020

- Use IPAFFS to notify of imports of live animals into GB on a CHED-D arriving on or after 14
 December
- We will make the switch from Traces to IPAFFS for GB imports on the 14 December at 6am
- Any consignments still on Traces after 6am, or those that have not been cleared by 6am will
 require manual clearance via the National Clearance Hub
