This Market Access Advice (MAA) provides an update to MAA 2263 and notifies stakeholders of changes to certification for export of various inedible animal by-products (ABPs) to Great Britain (not Northern Ireland).

Export certificates (Table 1) have been amended to comply with changes published to United Kingdom (UK) model certificates in October and December 2022. Updated certificates are now available for use.

Amendments to certificate templates were administrative in nature and do not change the eligibility of Australian product.

Certificate IGBB - Raw material for the manufacture of petfood

Amendments to IGBB introduce a "delete as appropriate" cross out option under section II.1.3. This clarifies selection of appropriate options relevant to certain ABPs under II.1.7 such as hatchery byproducts, eggs and egg by-products and day-old chicks killed for commercial reasons. For these products, attesting to slaughter conditions is not relevant.

Certification requirements

For certificates to the UK, exporters are reminded:

- ABP certificates to the UK require manual cross-outs. It is recommended exporters submit requests for certification which allows sufficient time to work with their regional office to ensure certificates and cross-outs are completed correctly.
- Replacement certificates may only be issued in cases of clear administrative errors.
- Certificates must be issued on or before date of departure of the consignment.

Trade to Northern Ireland

Trade to Northern Ireland must use the existing European Union (EU) certificates in accordance with the Northern Ireland Protocol agreed between the United Kingdom (UK) and the EU. Exports to Northern Ireland must continue to meet EU regulations and marketing standards including the relevant EU model certificate.

The department strongly advises exporters to work closely with their importers to ensure product is eligible to be exported to Northern Ireland as above and to contact the department if there are any difficulties with clearance of consignments.

The Manual of Importing Country Requirements (Micor) will be updated to reflect this market access advice.
